We travelled there on a coach, stopping off at an exciting adventure playground at Brockhole near Lake Windermere on the way. When we got there, we were put into our dormitories with our friends. We even had to make our own beds! Then went for a walk around the grounds and saw lots of the fun things we would be doing that week. After some unpacking and a delicious meal, we played in the gardens outside then went to bed to get plenty at rest for our fun packed week.

We were split into 3 groups and given our own instructor for the week who would look after us and lead our adventures. Some of the activities we took part in were rock scrambling, mountain walks, caving, canoeing, orienteering, swimming, ghyll scrambling and we took turns on the famous High Borrans ropes course. On the night times we had lovely food! We had a pudding every night. Yum! Then we'd have some time to play outside, we even had a campfire one night and toasted marshmallows.

RNLI - Water Safety workshops

On Monday 7th October, we had the pleasure of welcoming members of the RNLI lifeguard team. Over the course of the day, they taught classes in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 about their roles and the importance of water safety. All the talks were both very informative and very entertaining. We hope that all the children enjoyed the talks and took some important lessons from them. BRING IT ON - STEM

This half term, Year 6 have had the opportunity to go to the Beacon of Light in Sunderland and visit the 'Bring it on' Primary STEM day. Everybody had a fantastic day looking at all of the different stalls and taking part in a variety of experiments and activities. It was great to see so many of our pupils actively engaged in STEM activities and getting the opportunity to use new technologies. All of the class were excellent ambassadors for the school and it was an extremely enjoyable visit.

Hazlewood remains to be only one of five schools chosen by North Tyneside Learning Trust to be part of this initiative. The initiative is designed to inspire young girls in Key Stage 2 to develop their skills and confidence in using technology, with the hopes of empowering them to pursue a career in this field. This is in response to the disproportionate number of women in technological careers.

This half term we began our work with The North Shields Heritology Project (bringing the heritage of North Shields to life using new technologies – for more information please visit <u>https://heritologists.com/</u>). Together, we visited Proto in Gateshead, the first digital production facility in Europe working on projects as large as the production of Guardians of the Galaxy! We learned all about immersive technology and we used virtual reality headsets as well as surround sound audio. The girls listened to a speech from a very inspiring lady who told us "tech needs writers, marketers and production, it's not just about building the tech... find what your strength is".

Next half term we will continue to work with the Heritologists and the DigiLadies will start a lunch time Digi club where girls from KS2 will be welcome to come and develop their tech skills.

School - Centred Initial Teacher Training (SCITT) Trainee - Mr Danny Driver


