

Assessment

Reading

- Half-termly RWI assessments in KS1 and EYFS.
- Accelerated Reader reading tests termly (KS2). YARC to identify specific needs if required.
- HAST spelling tests termly (KS2).

Maths

- At the end of each term formative assessment must be completed through the use of White Rose Assessments.
- Regular assessment of times table knowledge to be completed through TT Rockstars or paper copies.

Writing

- Pre assessment in KS1 and 2 with a cold write for each unit of work
- Post assessment in KS1 and 2 with a hot write for each unit
- EYFS assessment based on Development Matters

Science

- Assessment sheet and knowledge organisers (KS2 only) must be in children's books at the start of each unit.
- All units should start with a discussion on what children already know about the unit. KWL/ Concept map to be in books and reviewed ongoing throughout the units. Child led questions to be displayed on learning wall.
- A mini quiz is to be used as revision tool at the start of each lesson. Especially for vocabulary.

Phonics

- Pupils will be assessed at the end of each half term and groups adjusted accordingly.
- Pupil assessments will entered on to year group tracking sheets on the Ruth Miskin Schools Portal.

Foundation Subjects

- Pupils' work will be assessed by recording examples using Seesaw.
- Pupil progress can then be assessed overtime at key points which may include at the end of a term, the end of a year or the end of a key phase.
- Formative assessment is on going and will happen during lessons, informing teacher planning and next steps.

P.E.

- Teacher and JF observe children throughout sessions– recognise areas children need to work on to adapt planning for next session or immediate challenge given to those who find the task not challenging enough– e.g. adapting equipment or space to offer challenge.
